Cape Vincent – Printed copies of the “Avian and Bat Studies for the proposed St. Lawrence Windpower Project Final Report, April 2006-May 2007” are now available with each public copy of the St. Lawrence Windpower’s Draft Environment Impact Statement, in the following locations: Cape Vincent Town Clerk, Cape Vincent Village Clerk, Cape Vincent Library, St. Lawrence Wind Farm Office, Lyme Town Clerk Office and Lyme Free Library. The supplemental document, prepared by Western EcoSystems Technology, Inc. was developed based on input from the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service. These avian and bat studies reveal the methods and results from the Nocturnal Martine Radar Survey, the Raptor Migration Surveys, the Breeding Bird Survey, the Nocturnal AnaBat Surveys, and the Waterfowl and Winter Raptor Survey. This study provides supplemental findings to the “Avian and Bat Studies: Interim Report, April 2006-November 2006,” which was made available by Western EcoSystems Technology, Inc., in May 2007.
